### Introduction

In this sermon we introduce the new series on disciple making and explain how it is the task of every Christian.

<sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> <u>Go</u> therefore and **make disciples** of all nations, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> <u>teaching</u> them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

- 1) The Great Commission is the assignment of every Christian.
  - a) Make disciples by "going" Introduction
  - b) Make disciples by "baptizing" Initiation
  - c) Make disciples by "teaching" Instruction
- 2) Every Christian is a missionary and minister of the gospel to the people they already know and the place they already live.


1)	Starter Question: What do you think of when you hear the word "disciple?"
2)	Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.
3)	How does v. 18 give force to what Jesus commands in vv. 19-20?
4)	How does the realization that "make disciples" (v. 19) is the main verb of these verses help us more accurately understand the meaning of this text?
5)	How are "going," "baptizing," and "teaching" aspects of making disciples?
6)	How should a church accomplish those three aspects of making disciples?
7)	How does this text command every Christian to be a missionary and minister of the gospel to the people around them and the place they work and live?
8)	Have you ever discipled someone or been discipled by someone before, and if so, what was your experience like?
9)	How might "disciple making" begin even before someone becomes a Christian and extend throughout their Christian life?
10)	If you are being honest, what would prevent you from being a disciple maker?







Fit these words into the crossword puzzle. Then transfer the words from the puzzle to the lines below.
