Sunday Text Questions for John 3:22 (“Disciple-making as a Way of Life” Series)
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- 1) Starter Question: What does “relational disciple-making as a way of life” mean to you? Describe it. Tell stories of where you have seen it in everyday life. Be as specific as you can.

- 2) In John 3:22, “spent some time with” (diatribo) means extended, intentional time together— “to rub through.” How do the following passages expand and inform our understanding of how Jesus was rubbing off on his disciples? Proverbs 27:17, Proverbs 13:20, 1 Corinthians 15:33, Hebrews 10:24

- 3) We think of spending time with Jesus *and others* as “withness.” In Luke 8:1-3 who does this “withness” include?

- 4) Share a story about how someone is currently rubbing Jesus’ heart and way of life off on you?

- 5) Share a story about how God is using you to rub Jesus’ heart and way of life off on someone else (for God’s glory).

- 6) Go to www.DisciplemakersPrayer.com. Pray the Disciple-maker’s Prayer by yourself and together with someone when possible for the next 21 days. Look up each of the seven passages of Scripture listed at the top and try to find each passage of Scripture in the prayer.
