Introduction

In this passage we learn important categories for thinking about men and women in the church.

The Text: 1 Timothy 2:11-15

¹¹Let a woman learn quietly with all submissiveness. ¹²I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. ¹³For Adam was formed first, then Eve; ¹⁴ and Adam was not deceived, but the woman was deceived and became a transgressor. ¹⁵Yet she will be saved through childbearing—if they continue in faith and love and holiness, with self-control.

- 1) Historic, orthodox Christianity offers a beautiful and foundational perspective on men and women. *a) The Design*
 - b) The Divorce
 - c) The Dilemma
- 2) Christians must enter any discussion on gender with gospel categories and spectacles.
 - a) There are two official positions in Evangelicalism today regarding men and women in the church.
 - "Egalitarianism" think "RIGHTS" Galatians 3: ²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, <u>there is no</u> <u>male and female</u>, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.
 - "Complementarianism" think "ROLES" Ephesians 5: ²² <u>Wives, submit to your own husbands</u>, as to the Lord. ²³ For <u>the husband is</u> <u>the head of the wife</u> even as Christ is the head of the church, ... ²⁵ <u>Husbands</u>, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her...
 - b) If I could offer an unofficial position that avoids some of the baggage of the others:
 - "Mutualism" think "RESPONSIBILITIES and REWARDS" Ephesians 5: ¹⁷ Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. ¹⁸ And ... be filled with the Spirit ... ²¹ submitting to one another out of reverence for <u>Christ</u>. ²² Wives, [submit] to your own husbands, as to the Lord...
- 3) These difficult and debated five verses will require several things from the Christian.
 - a) We need to be ready for Scripture to offend us.
 - b) We need to be willing to examine our cultural assumptions and practices.
 - c) We need to sit under the Word of God as humble students and faithful disciples of Jesus.

Response: God made you man and woman for his glory and our mutual good. The church needs to remember this truth.

Sunday Text Questions for 1 Timothy 2:11-15, Part 1 ("Entrusted to You" Series) February 14, 2021 Pastor Mickey Klink

- 1) Starter Question: In what ways is the Bible's assumptions and teachings on men and women different than the assumptions and teachings in contemporary culture?
- 2) Read Genesis 1:27-28. What does the fact that both men and women are made in God's image and given authority teach us about God's perspective on gender?
- 3) Read Genesis 2:18-25. What do these verses teach us about the interdependence and harmony between men and women?
- 4) Read Genesis 3:16. What does this verse teach us about the strife and conflict that exists between men and women?
- 5) Read Galatians 3:27-29. Why are these verses (especially v. 28) influential to those who hold to "egalitarianism," the position that believes there is no biblical distinction in any way between men and women?
- 6) Read Ephesians 5:22-33. Why are these verses influential to those who hold to "complementarianism," the position that believes there is a God-designed structure that distinguishes the roles of men and women?
- 7) What practical differences might exist between egalitarianism and complementarianism in the local church?
- 8) Read Ephesians 5:21. How does this verse put the verses that follow in a proper context?
- 9) Why is gender such a debated topic in the world today, including the church?
- 10) How can we know if our views on gender are rooted in the Bible or in a particular culture?

Further study this week: Read Genesis 1-3 and look at all the ways it instructs the Christian about the relationship between man and woman.
