Introduction
In this passage God presents to us the power, perfection, and provision of the death of Jesus Christ
The Text: John 19:28-42
1) The death of Jesus proclaims the power of the cross to the world (vv. 28-30).
2) The perfection of Jesus' death counters every one of our imperfections (vv. 31-37).
3) The burial of Jesus symbolically explains the provision of God for his people (vv. 38-42).
Response
The death of Jesus is declared by the Gospel of John to be the means of life for the world.

Sunday Text Questions John 19:28-42 October 6, 2019 Pastor Mickey Klink

1) Starter Question: Why is the crucifixion of Jesus so important to the Christian faith?
2) Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.
3) Why does this passage want to connect so many details of Jesus death' to what Scripture promised i the Old Testament (cf. vv. 28, 36-37)?
4) Do you think the Roman guards are being helpful or hurtful by their actions in v. 29 (clue: read Psalm 69:21)?
5) Why might it be important that v. 30 says Jesus "gave up his spirit?"
6) With the help of 1 John 5:6-8, how is v. 34 speaking not only historically but also symbolically about the sacrifice of Jesus and the coming Spirit from Jesus?
7) What is the narrator trying to tell us when he interjects in vv. 35-37?
8) How does the reappearance of Nicodemus in v. 39 suggest that he is no longer a challenger of Jesus (3:1-15) but a follower of Jesus (cf. 7:40-52)?
9) How do the symbolic details of the burial of Jesus (100-pounds of fragrances, a garden, and a virgin tomb) guide us to see deeper, theological truths about Jesus death?
10) How would you explain the significance of Jesus' death to a non-Christian?
Further study this week: Genesis 2 on the first garden (Mon); Revelation 21-22 on the third garden (Tues); Psalm 69 on the suffering and thirst of Christ (Wed); Exodus 12 on the Passover and hyssop

(Thurs); 1 John 5 on the necessity of the blood and water of Christ (Fri).
