



Sunday Text Questions for 1 Chronicles 16:8-24

- 1) Starter Question: What place in the world do you think would be the most difficult to minister and share the gospel?
- 2) Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.
- 3) In the larger context, this “song of thanks” (v. 8) is in response to a victory God provided his people. What has God done for all Christians that should cause us to sing to him songs of thanks?
- 4) This text is loaded with commands to sing and praise God (see vv. 8, 9, 11, 23). What are some ways we can individually and corporately obey this command to sing praises to God?
- 5) How should Christians obey the command in v. 8: ““Make known his [God’s] deeds among the peoples?” In what ways have you shared with others the amazing works of God?
- 6) In vv. 15-18, the song of thanks speaks of an “everlasting covenant” (v. 17). How is Jesus and the New Covenant the final expression of this everlasting covenant?”
- 7) Vv. 19-22 speak of the ways God protected his people in the past. How is God protecting his people, the church, throughout the world today?
- 8) How should an individual Christian apply v. 23 in his or her personal life and ministry? How should Hope Church apply v. 23 in its corporate life and ministry?
- 9) In what ways can we obey v. 24 and declare the glory of God among all nations and peoples of the world?
- 10) What *truths to believe* or *actions to obey* does this passage of Scripture teach us?
