The Text: John 7:1-13						
Scripture shows us how it should be read, especially that Jesus fulfills all the <i>people</i> , <i>places</i> , and <i>promises</i> of the Old Testament (vv. 1-2).						
Jesus is the True Tabernacle, the one who redeems us and establishes God's presence (vv. 3-10).						
This text challenges us to understand who Jesus truly is, why we seek him, and how we relate to him (vv. 11-13).						

Response

Jesus is the True Tabernacle, the fulfillment of the world's hopes and joys, and the source of the family of God.

1) \$	Starter Question: How is the church a family?
2) 1	Read the text aloud and discuss together any significant observations or issues needing clarification.
3) \	Why were the Jews (the religious leaders) seeking to kill Jesus (v. 1)?
	What historical details regarding the Feast of Booths/Tabernacles are important to understand for this text to be interpreted correctly?
	What are the brothers of Jesus intending in vv. 3-4, and how does the narrator's comment in v. 5 help reveal their intentions?
6) \	What is Jesus revealing about his mission in his response to his brothers in vv. 6-7?
	Since Jesus cannot lie, how can we explain the apparent contradiction between v. 8 and v. 10 regarding Jesus' claim that he was not going to "this feast" (v. 8) and yet he goes after a short time (v. 10)?
	Read Matthew 12:46-50. How can Jesus say Christians are part of the same family, and what might a health balance between our earthly (biological) family and spiritual (church) family look like?
	Vv. 11-13 reveal that the people had very different opinions and responses to Jesus. What are the opinions and responses to Jesus by the people in our community today?
10) \	What truths to believe or actions to obey does this passage of Scripture teach us?
